



**USAGSO - Kuwait  
Spring 2000 Campout  
March 8 - 10  
Texaco Compound**

**Basic Costs of Event:** The LTC will contribute 1 KD per girl to cover basic costs including Thursday night campfire snacks (s'mores and hot cocoa). The LTC will NOT be providing any other meals or snacks. It is up to the individual troops to provide meals and drinks for their troops during the campout. Campout patches have been designed and are on order. We expect to receive them in April and will distribute them then. They will cost approximately 500 fils per girl. At this time we do not anticipate any additional charges for the campout other than an activity fee for the tie-dye class detailed below.

**Activity Fee for Tie-Dye Class:** Any troop electing to participate in the tie-dye class will be charged an activity fee of 1 KD per girl to cover the cost of all materials needed except the cotton Tshirts which need to be provided by the participants.

**Please remember:** We must provide a complete list of the names and Civil ID numbers of all participants. In addition, we need to have the license plate numbers of any cars that will be transporting campers to and from the campout and/or remaining on the premises during the campout. All drivers must be prepared to hand their civil IDs to the Texaco security guard at the entrance for the duration of their stay within the compound.

## Spring Campout Schedule

### Wednesday, March 8<sup>th</sup>

**4:00 PM – 5:00 p.m.:** Registered troops arrive with their leaders, check in with the registrar and set up camp in the designated location. Troops can pick up their tents, camp stoves and charcoal grills after they have completed the registration process.

Note: Following our usual procedures, a parent will check their child in with their individual troop leaders and then the troops will proceed to Texaco for campout registration. Troop leaders will provide the registrar with all check-in forms, permission slips, health histories, etc. before the troop is given the OK to set up camp.

**5:30 p.m. OPENING CEREMONY      TROOP 17**

Dinner and setup is by troop. There are no scheduled activities Wednesday evening.

## Thursday, March 9<sup>th</sup>

Breakfast is by individual troop

**9:00 AM – Additional troop check-in time.** Procedures will be the same as listed above.

**10:00 AM – 11:00 AM: Troop 26 tie-dye class**

**11:00 AM – 12:00 PM: Troop 15 and Troop 23 tie-dye class**

**12:00 PM - Lunch by troops**

**1:30 PM – 2:30 PM: Tie-dye class for Troop 17.**

**3:00 PM – 4:00 PM: Tie-dye class for Troop 13.**

**5:00 PM - Dinner and Troop time** - Girls leaving early must leave at this time. We will have some balls, jump ropes, frisbees, volleyballs, etc. available. Each troop cooks own dinner and cleans up. If your girls need experience in outdoor cooking, they will probably use the whole time fixing and cleaning up after dinner, with little or no time for recreation during this time.

**7:30 PM - "Campfire" program** – Coordinated by Troop 26. Each troop has already been asked to prepare a skit to perform at the campfire. Hot cocoa and s'mores provided by LTC. Any other snacks would be provided by troops.

Early rise and quick breakfast for all troops.
